

DAUBENFELD Jean Joseph Gérard

Biography

Jean Joseph Gérard DAUBENFELD was probably born around 1920.

In 1952 he resided in Wecker and had an interest in designing elements for building construction.^{1 2}

In 1962 Jean Joseph Gérard resided in Luxembourg-city (12 rue Astrid) and carried the title of “*cand. ing.*” At that time, he invented improvements for plastic extrusion machines.

¹ In 1954 the Diekirch company MAPRE (*Machines et Appareils de Précision, S. A.*) filed a Luxembourg patent application designating as inventor a person by the name of Jean DAUBENFELD with residence in Bonnevoie (Patent LU32690). The relevant technical field corresponds to that of interest to Jean Joseph Gérard documented in the early 1960s. No evidence could be found that Jean Joseph Gérard DAUBENFELD was the inventor designated in LU32690

² In the 1970s the local press refers to an “*Ingenieurbüro Jean Daubenfeld, bureau d’études du génie civil, béton armé et précontraint.* Is this the same person as the inventor of LU patents LU31793 and LU31794? Did Jean Joseph Gérard later adopt the single first name Jean?”
