

NEUEN-THERER Grégoire

(1825 - 1903) 1

Luxembourg-city

Biography

NEUEN was born 1825 in the heart of Luxembourg-city (272 rue marché aux herbes), as son of a *sellier*. His mother Angelica BOURLET was of rather poor origin, daughter of a "*civis sartoris hujus urbis*" (supported citizen of the city).

NEUEN's wife, Julie THERER, was the daughter of a huissier de salle au Gouvernement provincial. Both her parents were born in the Belgian province of Luxembourg (Houfallize, Bastogne).

NEUEN became a *Schlossermeister* and lived in the old part of Luxembourg-city with his growing family of eleven children, successively at the following addresses: ²

When NEUEN applied for a patent in 1865 his occupation was *fabricant de meubles en fer*. ³ NEUEN died in 1903 in Luxembourg-city (8 avenue Monterey).
